



Key elements include the use of arches, intricate geometric patterns, courtyards, minarets, Mashrabiya and ornate calligraphy, often featuring verses from the Quran


Seen in mosques, palaces, and gardens across the Middle East, Africa, and parts of Asia, where it continues to inspire, with its emphasis on harmony, symmetry, use of light and space and the seamless integration of art and structure.





99 Names of Allah




Dome of The Rock

The Dome of the Rock is one of the most iconic and significant religious structures in the world, located on the Temple Mount in the Old City of Jerusalem. The Dome of the Rock was completed in 691–692 CE during the reign of the Umayyad Caliph Abd al-Malik. It is one of the oldest surviving examples of Islamic architecture and one of the earliest Islamic monuments. The structure is built in an octagonal shape with a large central dome. The dome is covered in gold and dominates the skyline of Jerusalem, making it a visually striking symbol of the city.




