



Art of Creation: Celebrating Muslim Innovations

Rooted in faith, imagination, and expression, Art of Creation celebrates the divine connection between creativity and purpose. Islamic art has long reflected a harmony between the spiritual and material worlds, where every pattern, stroke, and form is guided by reflection and meaning.

This theme invites artists to explore creation as an act of devotion, expressing balance, symmetry, and beauty through their chosen medium. From calligraphy and geometry to abstract interpretations, Art of Creation encourages works that reflect the unity, order, and wonder found in the process of creating itself.


The corner of the Kaaba

This art piece portrays the Kaaba, the center of Islamic spirituality and architecture. Its geometric form and the draped kiswah highlight how faith has inspired centuries of innovation in architecture, calligraphy, and design. The Kaaba stands as both a symbol of unity and a source of artistic and cultural creativity. Together, the two works celebrate Islam's enduring legacy of creation—bridging spirituality with human progress, and reminding us that faith continues to spark innovation across time.

Heavenly Enlightenment

This artwork draws inspiration from the Hagia Sophia's dome in Istanbul, Turkey, showcasing its golden mosaics and a central calligraphic medallion featuring the Ayah Noor (Quran 24:35) in thuluth script. Organically constructed as a cathedral in the 6th century by the Christian Byzantine empire, Haga Sophia was taken over by the Ottomans in the 15th century and repurposed into a mosque. It symbolizes architectural adaptation of the Ottoman Islamic empire that later inspired other Structural marvels and respect for the traditions of art and knowledge of preceding empire. This artwork captures these attributes motivated by an enlightened mindset which itself resulted from the light of Islam aptly described in the Ayah Noor which refers to Allah "the Light of the heavens and the earth". Hence the title: "Heavenly Enlightenment".






Fatima Al-Fihri: Legacy of Learning

This painting honors Fatima Al-Fihri, founder of Al-Qarawiyyin Mosque and University. Through symbols of her donation, the mosque, the university, and Morocco's native flowers, it reflects her timeless contribution in education. As she graduated from that institute when she was 59.


SCRIPTED SQUARES
